This symposium covers various aspects relating to tropical and subtropical fruit trees including genetic resources, control of diseases and insect pests, storage and postharvest physiology as well as cultivation of temperate zone fruits in the countries located in the tropics and subtropics. All of us who have cooperated in this symposium hope that the discussions and exchanges of views will contribute the promotion of fruit production in the tropics and subtropics.
