I now have realized that how it is complicated and difficult to study virus problems. It is because that virus disease has 2 aspects of insect vector and virus itself. In addition, genetic resistance is one of the most important factors for the control of the disease.

It means, close cooperation is required among entomologists, virologists and plant breeders.

I believe the present symposium was so successful in exchanging information and views not only among different countries but also among scientists working on insects, virus and crop breeding.

On behalf of the Tropical Agriculture Research Center, I wish to mention that the center will continue to be the international forum to serve for the development of plant virology research.

Some proposals and requests on future cooperative research have also been made, such as taxonomy of rice viruses, international research program in tropics, seed bank, type culture and newsletter problems.

I think, this kind of proposal should be seriously taken up and discussed further among the peoples concerned.
