Closing Address

Of course, we neither think nor advocate that our findings are applicable as they are to tropical and sub-tropical regions. To ensure the establishment of proper cultivation technique in accordance with the natural conditions of the regions many practical researches should be carried out intensively and to accomplish that very close cooperation among the countries is important and indispensable. All of us concerned with tropical agricultural research in Japan hope to cooperate in this phase to full extent.

For the last three days we have tackled and discussed various problems of mutual interest and we have deepened our mutual understanding and friendship. If this Symposium has contributed even in a small way to the furtherance of cooperation among the participating countries, we are more than gratified.

We are to start on field trip for three days from tomorrow to Niigata prefecture which is one of Japan's rice bowls and now in harvesting season. I do sincerely hope you enjoy every minute of your study trip.

In conclusion, may I again thank each and every delegate for your undivided cooperation and may I also wish you a good health and a great success in your respective field of research. I thank you.
